ALICE SPRINGS

Nestled between the East and West MacDonnell Ranges, 'Alice' (as it's known by the locals) is famous for its beautiful desert landscapes, colourful characters, adventure and a strong Aboriginal history.



BLUE MOUNTAINS

Just a 90 minute drive from Sydney, the Blue Mountains are one of the country's most stunning natural attractions. Jump aboard the Scenic Railway and take a heart-stopping ride into Hamison Valley.



CANBERRA
