Queensland



The Gold Coast

The Gold Coast is known for its golden beaches and relaxed coastal energy, where mornings begin with ocean swims and evenings end with excellent dining and waterfront views. Beyond the coastline, the Gold Coast Hinterland reveals a quieter, greener side of cool mountain air, ancient forests and dramatic escarpments. In Lamington National Park and Springbrook National Park, walking trails lead through World Heritage rainforests to waterfalls and panoramic lookouts offering fresh air, stillness and spectacular outlooks.

Tropical North Queensland

In Queensland's far north nature takes centre stage and two of the planet's greatest natural wonders meet: the Great Barrier Reef and the Daintree Rainforest. From the relaxed and easily accessible gateways of Cairns and Port Douglas, travellers can explore the extraordinary Great Barrier Reef or venture into the ancient Daintree Rainforest, one of the oldest tropical rainforests on Earth. It's a place of remarkable biodiversity and a rich cultural heritage, unlike anywhere else in Queensland.


Reefsleep


Gold Coast


K'gari 4WD Adventure

World Heritage-listed K'gari (formerly Fraser Island) is the largest sand island on Earth and one of Queensland's most remarkable natural wonders. A 4WD adventure unlocks its ever-changing landscapes – from endless ocean beaches and towering sand dunes to crystal-clear freshwater lakes and lush rainforests growing from sand. It's raw, remote and unforgettable.



Whitsundays & Whitehaven Beach

Sailing through turquoise waters to Whitehaven Beach, with its swirling silica sands and postcard-perfect views, is a true bucket-list moment. Whitsundays Wandering

The magical Whitsundays offer an abundance of choice. From luxury retreats including qualia and The Sundays on Hamilton Island, to expansive homes and apartments where relaxation at your own pace is the order of the day. Discover iconic Whitehaven Beach, Heart Reef and explore both above and below the water with scenic flights, snorkelling tours and kayak paddles.



The Pull of Magnetic Island

Lying just off the coast from Townsville, Magnetic Island is easily accessible. Think laid-back charm, golden beaches and myriad nature trails to explore. More than two thirds of the island is national park and it's home to the region's largest colony of wild koalas. A stay here is more than just beaches and palm trees, it offers a very real and rustic charm all of its own.



The Great Barrier Reef

Stretching from Cairns in the tropical north to Bundaberg in the south, the Great Barrier Reef invites visitors to come and play, and stay for a while. Many of the islands are little more than sand cays but unique places to stay include Lady Elliot Island, a tiny coral cay that achieved 100% sustainability in 2020 and packed with exceptional experiences. Or, iconic Lizard Island, in the far north where luxury and adventure go hand in hand.



Wild on K'gari

The world's largest sand island offers travellers a very different island experience. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is a place of endless beaches, shifting sand dunes, wildlife and sparkling crystal clear lakes that take visitors from 4WD beach adventures to scenic flights and rainforest hikes.

The Gold Coast

The Gold Coast is where every day feels like a weekend. The rolling surf pounds endless beaches of golden sand where morning surfers carve through the waves and cafes offer coffee with ocean views. Days are spent browsing beachside markets and designer shops, soaking up the sun or diving headlong into the thrills and spills of the theme parks.



The Green and the Gold

Look beyond the beaches and the Gold Coast hinterland swaps salt air for cool, misty mornings, rainforest trails, waterfalls and sweeping mountain lookouts. This is where winding roads lead you deep into Springbrook National Park, past ancient trees and cascading falls, and into the World Heritage-listed wilderness of Lamington National Park, where treetop walks and birdsong replace the sound of surf.

Explore Tamborine Mountain, where boutique wineries, art galleries and welcoming cafés line leafy streets, inviting you to slow down and stay awhile. Discover glow-worm lit caves, hidden rock pools and lookouts that stretch all the way to the coast. This is the green beyond the gold and the perfect partner to beach life. Within easy reach of Brisbane, it can be explored in a day, but to truly uncover its many charms, give it a little longer.



Wildlife Wonders

Putting the wow into wildlife wonder is a Queensland speciality. Wildlife here feels gloriously untamed. From ancient rainforests where iridescent blue butterflies flit and tree kangaroos and flying foxes leap, to encounters with otherworldly cassowaries and cruises spotting crocodiles. Snorkelling and diving invite visitors to explore underwater worlds, while from May to November the Gold Coast becomes the 'Humpback Highway', with more than 40,000 humpback whales passing through.

Tropical North Encounters

Vibrant rainforest and crystal-clear waters make Tropical North Queensland a wildlife lover's paradise. Meet koalas, kangaroos, and crocodiles up close at family-friendly wildlife parks, or venture into the wild on guided tours to spot turtles, exotic birds, and elusive marsupials in their natural habitats. Educational and thrilling, these encounters leave lasting memories and a deeper appreciation of Queensland's unique ecosystems.



Great Barrier Reef Marine Life

Dive into the world's largest coral reef system and witness a kaleidoscope of marine life. Snorkel or dive among colourful fish, reef sharks, and sea turtles, or explore from a glass-bottom boat for a calmer perspective. Guided tours introduce conservation insights and behind-the-scenes stories, making the reef a spectacular classroom of nature for adventurers of all ages.

Outback Wildlife Adventures

Queensland's outback surprises with its rugged beauty and remarkable fauna. Spot emus, dingoes, and red kangaroos against vast desert landscapes, or join eco-tours at remote stations to learn about local species and their adaptations. Wide-open skies and untouched terrain make every sighting a moment of awe, blending adventure with education in the heart of the Australian wilderness.



Coastal & Island Treasures

Queensland's islands and coastal reserves are havens for seabirds, marine turtles, and rare shorebirds. From guided eco-cruises to peaceful beach walks, visitors can experience nesting sites, seasonal migrations, and playful dolphin pods. These intimate wildlife encounters highlight the state's commitment to conservation while offering magical, up-close moments with nature's coastal wonders.

Outback Adventures

Outback Queensland is the Sunshine State at its most evocative and atmospheric. Vast skies, the unmistakable deep red earth and the living culture which is written in the stories told over millennia, this is the heart of Queensland.



Spirit of the Outback

Immersive experiences are shaped by landscape, history and people. From the dramatic escarpments of Mount Mulligan, to dinosaur country in Winton. Those who venture to Longreach will be rewarded with tales from the pioneers, the Qantas Founders Museum and the Australia Stockman's Hall of Fame. Guided walks, heritage trails and museums, bring this region to life.

You can even climb aboard an old stage coach with Cobb & Co for a ride along the original Longreach-Windorah mail route. Access to the outback is all part of the adventure, be it by road, air or by rail, aboard the Spirit of the Outback.
